## How California Rice Varieties Are Named

The Rice Experiment Station (RES) has released over 40 rice varieties since 1969. In 1979 a uniform naming system for new publically developed rice varieties was adopted based on grain type, maturity group and order of release. Names begin with a letter (or a word in case of specialty varieties) followed by a three digit number.

- A prefix letter/word
  - The S, M or L at the beginning of the varietal name designates the grain type: Short, Medium or Long (see photo to the left). This designation is actually the grain length to width ratio (USDA Grain Inspection Handbook)
  - Specialty rice will carry a descriptive word prefix such as Calmochi (waxy sweet rice) or Calmati (basmati-like rice).
  - The **first digit** indicates the maturity group of that variety.
    - 1 = Very early
    - 2 = Early
    - 4 = Late

The maturity is based on time to 50% heading (the day when approximately half the panicles in a field have emerged from the boot) which varies according to temperature, planting date, location and year. In general, for the RES at Biggs:

Very early =  $\leq 80$ days to 50% heading

Early = >80 to 90 days to 50% heading

Late = >100 days to 50% heading

• The **last two digits** indicate the order of release for that grain type and maturity group. For example, M206 was the 6<sup>th</sup> early maturing medium grain released.
